

CROWD CONTROL

The Board of Education has the responsibility for crowd control for on-site school sponsored games/activities/events. This responsibility is delegated to the district administrator or designee.

The district has the right to set reasonable crowd control rules and enforcement procedures to ensure the health and safety of the crowd and participants.

A ticket or invitation is a license to attend and not a property right and thus may be revoked without refund in the event of:

1. Disruptive or disorderly behavior, including profane or abusive language
2. Noncompliance with school rules related to the game/activity/event
3. Non-attendance in school
4. Refusal to cooperate with crowd control personnel or comply with their requests

It is expected that all spectators will be in the part of the building where the event is taking place. WIAA regulations will guide behavior including signs, noisemakers, and other activities that incite the crowd or disrupt the activity.

In case of inappropriate behavior:

1. A warning to comply with crowd control personnel directive
2. If verbal warning is not heeded, spectators will be asked to leave the grounds
3. If a spectator refuses to leave school grounds, law enforcement will be called and citations may be issued.
4. Students may be subject to suspension or other disciplinary procedures including being barred from attending future events.
