

TRANSPORTATION ON OTHER THAN SCHOOL BUSES

This policy does not concern a parent taking their own child to a school sponsored event nor does it concern the parental privilege of transporting friends of their child to school related events as long as the sponsor is the parent; however, when the school is the promoter or sponsor of the transportation required to get to an event, the following rules apply and evidence must be available in the school office for any such school sponsored non-bus transportation.

If a vehicle other than a bus is used to transport school children to and /or from school sponsored activities and the school sponsors the mode of transportation, the vehicle and driver must meet or exceed the following qualifications:

1. Insurance – Property damage and bodily injury coverage must meet State guidelines.
2. The vehicle must be inspected annually for compliance with requirements of S.110.075, Chapter 347. The owner may have the school district's mechanic inspect the vehicle.
3. The driver must hold a valid Wisconsin drivers license and be at least eighteen years old.
4. The driver must have sufficient use of both hands and the foot normally employed to operate the foot brake and accelerator.
5. The driver's driving record shall be checked by the school district's authorized personnel on the State web site, and the driver shall be approved only if there are no:
 - a. Major driving citations such as reckless driving, etc,
 - b. DWI citations
 - c. Drug related citations
 - d. Felony citations that would cause concern for transporting or supervising students
 - e. Other citations that the administration deems inappropriate to be given responsibility for transportation or supervision of district students
 - f. Or any other offenses as listed under S.343.31(1).
